PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT

My remarks are addressed to all sections of the school community, and of course, to anyone else who is prepared to be interested in them. However, I feel that this particularly a time to draw everyone's attention to the vital role of parents in the work of the school.

Francis Douglas College is a school which has, throughout its history, had magnificent support from the parents it was designed to serve. Right from the first public meeting in the Regent Theatre, New Plymouth in 1946, until the present day there has been a continuous and growing interest in the conduct of the school. In the early days, of course, it was a patient faithfilled filled interest, which bore all obstacles and which led to the opening of the school in 1959. Since then it has been an active and informed interest in what the school is actually doing, and a desire to be involved in whatever way is practical.

Signs of this interest are easily recognised. The school is well supported with embarrassingly heavy enrolments, parents' committees are generously filled, parents' meetings are well attended and parent-teacher interviews will normally run to almost a hundred per cent attendance. By all indications the standing of the school in the community at large is extremely high. Why is this so? What are the factors contributing to this high regard for the school? It will be useful to consider some of these not from any sense of smug satisfaction, but as a means of drawing attention to their importance.

One of the greatest strengths of the school is the very interest in it by its parent community. Such interest is active and involved. Less and less can parents afford to be merely passive supporters with a blind faith in the school, or an attitude which leads them to leave everything to the Principal and Staff - to see that their duty consists merely in enrolling their children and paying the school fees. No, just as the children need interested support from their parents so does the school. Parents need to know its programmes - especially in Religious Education - and be able to offer advice and direction. There must be strong lines of communication between parents and school so as to establish a highly developed sense of mutual understanding. Such understanding and support has a profound effect on both the parents and the staff. Pupils recognize the presence or absence of this understanding and are themselves affected. We are blessed at the College with this kind of school-parent interaction. However, it will need to develop as time goes on, and especially in the next few years as we run into situations demanding parent support if the school is to maintain its present usefulness. For example, the school is to integrate during the 1979 financial year. Integration will be good for it if, and only if, parents maintain and develop their interest in the school, elect a Board of Governors which strongly reflects their opinions, create an active parent-teacher association, enroll their children. This year our discussions on the Johnson Report emphasized the need for parents to be in control of what is done in the school in all areas of learning, but more especially in the areas of moral and social education. All this of course is not to minimize the contribution that the teaching staff has to make - its competence and professional dedication is not to be doubted. However there is a tendency to pay lip-service only to the concept that parents are the first educators. In practice, both parents and teachers have acted almost in isolation from each other, the former having minimal contact with the school, the latter sometimes trying to mould parents to the requirements of the school or considering any interference by parents either unwarranted or even unethical. On the contrary staff need to take positive steps to be in contact with parents, to meet them, to seek their opinion, to act in union with them, to know them, to encourage them to share in the educational process.

Another strength of the College at the present time is the spirit of the Staff. Such a spirit is obvious in the staff-room where a real community sense is shown. Staff members are interested in each other, work together and support each other in difficulties. Above all this - or because of it there, there is a common concern for the students. Such concern leads them to try to know pupils as personally as possible - names, family background, hobbies, interests, ambitions, successes and failures. It leads them as far as possible to work on a personal, family basis rather than on systems approach. Such a family attitude rejects any kind of unionism in the bad sense of clock-watching, being selfish of time and talent, Jealous of rights and privileges. Rather there is a generosity displayed in the giving of time and experience both during school hours as such - but at any time that it is required. And this undoubtedly reflects on the quality of work achieved. The understanding is there - the generosity is recognized by the pupils, so that a genuine family spirit is made real and appreciated by all - students, staff and parents.

A third strength is the small size of the school. With 500 pupils it is quite capable of being a reasonably close-knit community. Most staff would know most boys on a first name basis. Success by an individual or a group, no matter how young, is an occasion for family rejoicing while difficulties and sorrows of boys or their families are often shared by others. It is quite possible for all to contribute in various ways to the life of the school while all can expect help, support and comfort if necessary from staff or other students. There is thus developed a sense of peace and security which are a basic requirement for any real learning to take place.

And the basis of all these strengths is our Christian faith. It provides the inspiration for all that we are doing. It leads us to seek community as the means both of finding Christ and of serving him. It suggests the means of achieving community and cousels the self-denial and generosity necessary to achieve the same. It is the common bond between all. It offers meaning to life, and is at the same time both the means and the goal of education as we understand it.

So then, these and a great many others factors contribute to our strength as a school. Applications for enrolment continue to be very heavy and the hostel is bursting at the seams with a record enrolment this year. In the light of this we are encouraged to attempt expansions at a time of uncertain financial viability. A much-need hostel unit for senior boarders is well under way with the magnificent backing of parents and friends - particularly boarders' parents. Also planned are expansions needed in the school - not for expanding the rolls - but to offer improved teaching facilities. The Board is confident that these, too, will be well supported. Such extensions are required to improve what is at present available, while in preparation for integration extensive maintenance has already been carried out. However, besides renewing our school plant, we must continue to renew our school policies.

It should be characteristic of the Christian school to be restless about the present and to wish to press on to that which is more perfect. So while we consider our strengths - and pause to thank God for them - we must ever refine our approach to the educational task so as to be continually challenged by it. We have weaknesses and deficiencies which must be faced up to and we have ever new goals which we must try to achieve. In a recent letter the Superior General of the Brothers directed their attention to the educational service of the poor and to the promotion of justice. It seems to me that both concepts need emphasis in any development of school policy. Service of the poor has always been high on the list of the Brothers' priorities. It is well first of all not to miss the point of the word service. Our school is here to give service. Its policies must be geared to this end. Any renewal of policy must be guided by the need to offer better service to students and their parents. Tried and trusted methods and subjects are some of the riches that the school and the staff has to offer, of course, but at the same time we have to beware of assuming that parents and students have to be moulded to the school's image and likeness. Service is required. Service of the poor directs our attention towards a priority of interest in any disadvantaged pupils or families associated with the school. Hopefully integration will lighten the burden of school fees, but on a day to day basis continuing attention must be given to assisting individuals and groups to find peace and satisfaction in the school situation - to provide them with suitable support. It calls us to be sensitive about enrolment and the basis of preference. It is appropriate in the area of disciplinary action. An atmosphere of simplicity and sincerity should mark our approach to all problems. The school should be conscious of and concerned about the difficulties of families arising from various problems.

Finally, we are encouraged to work towards the promotion of justice. In practice, this means that the school should challenge students and their families to reflect on our society and its standards and to lead their lives based on the gospel principles of personal and social morality. Schools generally tend merely to pass on the values and outlook at present existing in society. Many of these values lead to the injustice existing around us - injustice that denies human liberty to millions of human beings. So it is the task of the staff to bring such injustices to the attention of students, and the task of the school to offer permanent challenges to society to examine its values - one of the functions of our special character, one of the challeges we have always had as a Catholic school, but one which more than ever we must be aware of as we move towards integration.

HOSTEL BOARD

As the integration of Francis Douglas College approaches it is necessary to separate the administration of the school and the hostel. Following the advice of Br Quentin, Provincial of the Brothers, an interim Hostel Board was appointed late in 1977 to adminster the boarding hostel.

The following persons were appointed to the Board as representatives of parents, the school Board and staff: Messrs. B.Jeffries (Chairman), M.Finnigan, L.Walsh, Br Osmund (Principal), David (Secretary) and Mesdames C.Powell, P.Gopperth, J.Poole.

During the first meeting of 1978, Brother Osmund outlined the areas of responsibility entrusted to the Board. The Board is entirely responsible for the management of the Hostel with the exception of major maintenance and capital expenditure, which remain the responsibility of the Board of Governors. Specific areas of responsibility include the annual budget, development of facilities, domestic staffing, maintenance of equipment and guidance in policy.

The Board's major area of concern during 1978 has been the proposed Hostel building project.

The Hostel Board has worked with the Board of Governors in raising the necessary finance. The main thrust of fundraising throughout contributing areas has been the debenture scheme. Members of the Hostel Board invited representatives in boarding areas to assist them in approaching people to participate in the scheme. In addition to the debenture scheme area representatives organised social activities to raise money for the project. The enthusiasm with which Board members and area representatives approached their difficult task is most encouraging and is evidence for the positive support of the project among persons associated with the College.

The Board is presently discussing a proposed constitution. It is hoped that the Hostel Board will be constituted early in 1979. This important step will necessitate the election of parent representatives to the Board.

My sincere thanks to all members of the Board. Attendance at meetings and coping with associated business has involved many hours of work during the year, often with personal sacrifice for those involved. I look foward to working with the Board and their strong support during 1979.

BOARD NOTES

During the past year the Board has been involved principally on three major tasks — all of them related in some way to integration.

An extensive maintenance programme has been carried out on all existing buildings and is nearing completion thanks to the drive of Mr L. Sole and the planning of the building subcommittee. And I would like to thank the members of this sub-committee for their generosity in attending frequent meetings and planning sessions.

The second task has been the planning of hostel extensions for senior boarders. This project is now well under way and it is hoped to complete it by the second term of next year. Apart from a bank loan, the finance has been obtained through the generosity of parents and friends of the College entering into our debenture scheme. May I express appreciation for the magnigicent support we have received for this venture. Hopefully this project will be followed up with another to refurbish the old hostel facilities.

The other task the Board has undertaken has been the planning of extensions to the school. This planning has been long and protracted. Application has been made to the State Housing Corporation for loan finance and plans submitted to the Education Department

for science labs and other teaching facilities, but we are still awaiting advice as to what we can build.

The financial supervision of the College continues to be one of the major concerns of the board. It is particularly difficult to organize our resources as we approached integration. However, we are able to remain viable in spite of huge rises in the costs of wages, food and services because of the support given by the vast majority of parents in school fees and in various fund raising activities.

The Board would like to congratulate the Hostel Board now finishing its first year of operation. It has had a successful first year under the guidance of its chairman Mr B. Jeffries and contributed greatly to the successful operation of the debenture scheme for the hostel.

May I exprss appreciation to the members of the board for their continued service. Meetings have always been extremely well attended and members ready to offer time and experience. Particular thanks to the chairman Mr K. Mulcahy and the treasurer Mr M. Finnigan.

Finally may I offer thanks to all associated with the school who have contributed to its well being in any way over the past year.

During August of this year the assembled Staff was advised that in December 1978 Brother Osmund Uniacke was to complete his service as Principal of Francis Douglas College. Brother Raphael, himself a former Principal of this school, clearly emphasized that because of forthcoming College Integration, it was found necessary to make immediate staff changes to facilitate static appointment of senior Religious during the teething years of Integration administration

While fully accepting the logic for next year's transfers and appointments, members of the staff were emotionally saddened by the announcement that Brother Osmund's expected six year appointment was to be prematurely terminated. It is known that this disappointment is shared by pupils, parents, the Board of Governors, the P.T.A., his professional colleagues and I'm certain by all who have been associated with Brother Osmund in so many fields during his five year dedicated service in Taranaki.

Brother Osmund was advised of his appointment to New Plymouth while on a study/leave excursion overseas. As he has suggested, he received the notification with some misgivings and apprehensions. Brother visited the school late in the year preceeding his appointment. It was immediately evident that the challenge would be met with complete personal and professional dedication. From first association and throughout his term in New Zealand, he has worked with tremendous enthusiasm and extended total support to all associated committees and particularly to parents, pupils and staff.

Over the five years, Brother's first priority was always his staff mambers. He offered himself unselfishly to counsel, guide and enthuse all under his direction. Teachers responded to responsibility delegation with a spirit of pride and unity. Loyalty and co-operation annually strengthened to the present extremely high standard. It is suggested with confidence, that the total staff would echo unreservedly that Brother Osmund will be recalled as a lovable and caring Principal. He dedicated his total self to his position and particularly to pupils and staff. And what better love?

Brother's commitment to youth is total. In addition to his heavy administration duties as Principal he taught with dedication mainly in Senior school. This total involvement enabled Arother to gain the respect of the school seniors whom he continually enthused, and supported in their leadership endeav-

In addition to the heavy administration and teaching output, Brother continually indicated his energy and enthusiasm by fully participating in the coachines. His keenness to further develop musical appreciation within the school is widely known. There are notable facility improvements and a gradual increase in pupil interest. Brother Osmund further emphasised his musical talents and interest in community participation by joining the inter-denominational Ars Nova Choir which presents concerts of extremely high standard.

He recognised the need for a school tramping club and his personal love for this activity was encouragement to the increasing number of participating pupils. Very many past school cadets recall the personal satisfaction of completing the strenuous Mt Egmont circuit. Quickly recognising the Taranakian's love for rugby, Brother skillfully coached the "Seconds" throughout his term in New Plymouth.

Because of his full commitment to youth he found it most difficult to fully organise and display his potential on the golf course Perhaps this was fortunate for members of staff, who as it was, found the chase of the rather lengthy handicap, costly. Brother Osmund has fully supported social and recreational staff gatherings which have accomplished so much in strengthening a full community spirit of loyalty and unity amongst the Brothers and lay staff.

Brother Osmund will recall very numerous happy memories of New Zealand, especially in Taranaki and very deservedly so, because he contributed total vocational love to Francis Douglas College. I am certain that pupils, both past and present, staff, parents, the Taranaki community and all who have enjoyed Brother's lovable friendship would wish complete appreciation recorded. In wishing Brother Osmund every possible happiness in his future hustralian appointment, it is with a very genuine hope that he will be able to frequently return to the school to which he has offered such inspiring dedicated service.

May God continue to bless the life and vocation of Brother Osmund Uniacke.




FORM 4 CRICKET

BASKETBALL - 1978


Basketball at Francis Douglas has gradually grown from being a minor sport to one of major importance. The number of teams has grown from four in 1977 to ten in 1978. Notable achievements were participation in the Regional tournament by the intersecondary team for the first time, winning both the under-14 and under-16 grades in the junior competition, and being runners-up in the local competition in both B and D grade. 
SENIOR A - Captain: Mark Power

JUNIOR VOLLEYBALL




