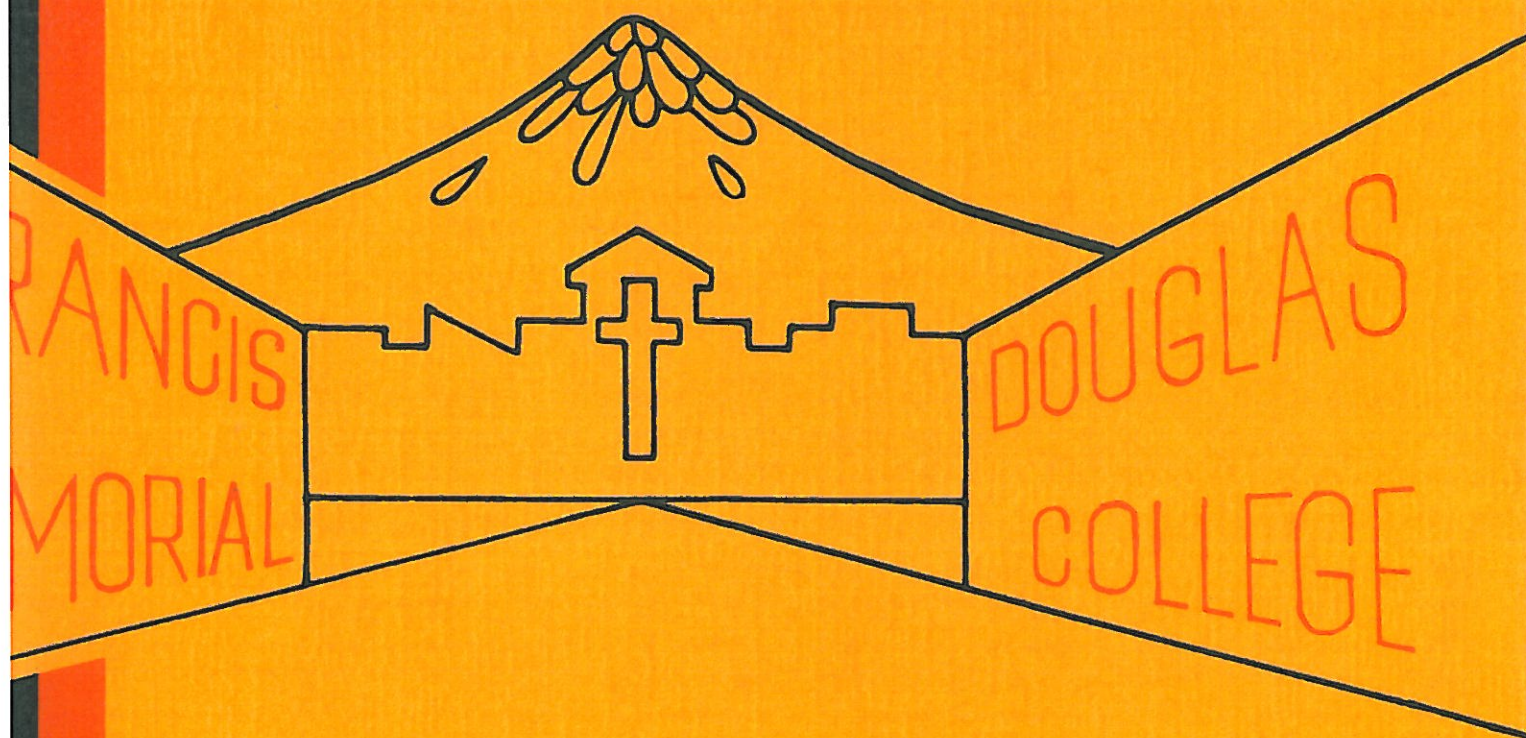

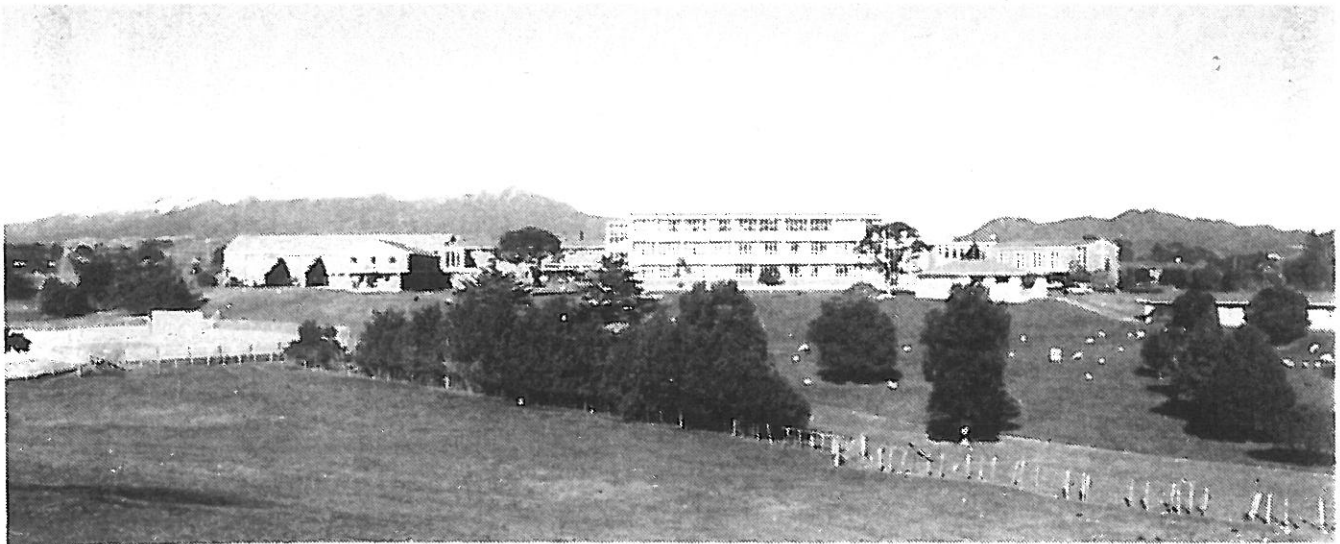

FRANCIS DOUGLAS MEMORIAL COLLEGE
BOARD OF GOVERNORS 2ND ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting this report for the first full year since integration, it is pertinent to comment on the functions of the Board and its responsibilities.

Integrated private secondary schools in New Zealand are governed by controlling authorities which in our case is the Board of Governors. The Board is responsible for the provision of Secondary Education but also responsible for the general control of school buildings, grounds and for the appointment of teaching and non-teaching staff. The Board is not responsible for the provision of buildings or facilities but merely the control of the facilities provided. The Proprietors of the school has the responsibility for providing the facilities.

The role of the Board may be defined, in general terms as:

- (a) To determine the needs of the community.
- (b) To approve objectives and service development plans.
- (c) To approve major policy recommendation.
- (d) To review (monitor) results.

The responsibilities are:

- (a) To act as trustee for the Minister of Education.
- (b) To serve constituents (the community.)
- (c) To Govern (administration and management.)

The Board has during the year, come to terms with the above responsibilities and charges.

In the last year report, we appealed for continued support of all involved with the school and it is pleasing to note that this support has been evident to the same high level of previous years.

Falling roles continue to dominate the education scene in New Zealand and trends in roles are being jealously monitored. Private integrated secondary schools will undoubtedly draw fire if their roles do not fall to the same extent as their State counterparts. In this regard it is important that parents have the information to counter at best ill informed charges.

For example, Francis Douglas College can only accept 27 non-preference students and if enquiries exceed that number then they must be declined. Therefore, if our role remains static and neighbouring schools decline, then the above figure cannot be considered significant, especially as the twenty seven is spread right throughout the school and not first year entrants, so the cause must lie elsewhere.

In closing, the Board commends for your attention and support the celebration of the College's first 25 years next year.



PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

In the course of this year the last of the Catholic schools were integrated into the state system and this marked the end of a process which began many years ago. Through the efforts of countless men and women, Catholic schools have finally been placed on a financially viable footing operationally. Major hurdles still exist, however, with capital debts and further buildings.

There is always a danger after having fought for so long to achieve something, that in the achievement the real meaning of what has been fought for can be lost. Integration of Catholic schools into the state system of education was not an end in itself. It was merely the means by which some financial security could be provided for these schools.

When the bishops first set up Catholic schools towards the end of the last century the reason for doing so was very different from the reason we would want to keep Catholic schools today. I would suggest also that the reasons why people who first fought for state aid wanted schools was different from the reasons why we want to keep them, or at least our reasons should be different. In the course of the time that the battle for state aid has been going on there have been major shifts in the Church of which the Catholic school is but an aspect. The Church's understanding of itself and its place in the world has undergone radical modification and the Catholic school cannot ignore this change and pretend that things are as they have always been.

If we claim to be Catholics now in 1983, then we must accept responsibility for ensuring that we are true to the call of the Church. We need to do our part to bring the Good News into the world of which we are a part, rather than trying to protect ourselves and others from it. The Church does not exist for its members. The Church exists for this world just as Jesus came for this world, and it is the Church's task to be a living, visible and




effective sign to all men of our shared humanity and of mankind's union with God. Thus the Church should consciously participate and share in the God who is Love, in order to share that love, as Christ did, with mankind.

If that is the attitude of the Church then as a Catholic school we need to look closely at the implications for us and the way in which we can more authentically be true to our call to be a functioning part of the Church.

One of the central considerations that was kept in mind throughout the negotiations surrounding integration, was the preservation of the "special character" of the Catholic schools. While the emphasis that was placed on this was done from good motives, care will have to be exercised in the future to ensure that the various safeguards do not work against the Catholic schools carrying out their mission as a part of the authentic mission of the Church.


As I have mentioned many times before, we must be different, and we must be seen to be different to justify our existence but that difference must be in offering some radical alternative. If we are not careful, the pre-occupation with the preservation of the legal "special character" can prevent us from creating a genuine radical character. The Catholic school has enormous potential to become a truly transforming and reconciling force in this culture of which it is a part. To do this, the school need people involved in its operation who are genuine, open, human people, people who are truly "religious" in the way in which they approach this world, the people they come across and the work they do with young people. Because these people are able to accept other people especially those who live with a different perspective from their own, it is possible that the young people they deal with will likewise come to be truly "religious". If our young people can grow up with an openness to



diversity and an appreciation that there are other ways of responding to life than what they have been exposed to, then they can "own" their Catholic faith as a genuine expression of love in a world which has been consecrated by God.

The question must be asked, therefore, whether seeking to keep pupils and teachers who have a Catholic tag as the only or at least the preferred population of Catholic schools is really going to enable the school to achieve its goal. Lukewarm Catholics can give counter witness to the Good News the school stands for, while a committed Muslim, for example, may be a greater challenge to the pupils to look carefully at their faith and "own" it. Likewise, pupils who are only nominally Catholic are being accepted into schools and other pupils are being excluded because they do not have the correct tag. To what extent can we claim to be offering a radical alternative if we are merely restricting what we have to offer to our own kind?

In seeking to be a genuine faith community this College is concerned about the way people are treated while here. We do not exist to be an isolated institution preparing boys for public exams. Rather it is hoped that as a result of having spent time here, pupils will be conscious of the responsibilities they have to enter into society at large with an awareness and sensitivity towards all people. To do this, the College must look very carefully at how the pupils are challenged to accept the responsibility for their own lives. In the way in which it deals with pupils the college must not give the impression that it is taking responsibility for the boy's life. Rather the boys must be lead to a greater freedom with the consequent acceptance of responsibility. They must be lead to see that there are always options and that whatever option they choose has certain consequences for which they take responsibility. The boys must not be protected from accepting the reasonable



consequences of their actions otherwise they will not grow to be responsible but always find excuses and push the responsibility onto someone else. It is important that we not merely teach pupils conformity to school rules and then label them responsible. Instead they must be confronted with having to evaluate their behaviour, decide on a course of action which will be better for them and then commit themselves to it. To do this successfully, however, they must believe that there is someone who is interested in them, who is involved with them, who believes in them. The staff and boys here at the College, the parents at home, can all contribute to providing this involvement with others in the College so that it is possible for the boys here to grow to be more responsible human beings.

If we are to take seriously the challenge to be an expression of the Church then we must be open to see that all that is human has been redeemed by Christ and is good. We should take the very experience of human living that is part of the boys' world and assist them to see that what Christ did was to throw light on the meaning of that existence through the life that he lived. Neither should he forget that the Good News is for all men, not just for Catholics.

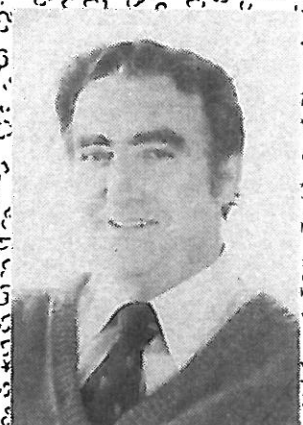

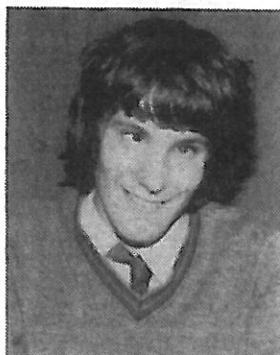
KEITH FINNERTY

Br. Oliver, with the help of the grounds person Donna Christiansen, deserve mention for their excellent work in getting the school grounds looking as good as they do.

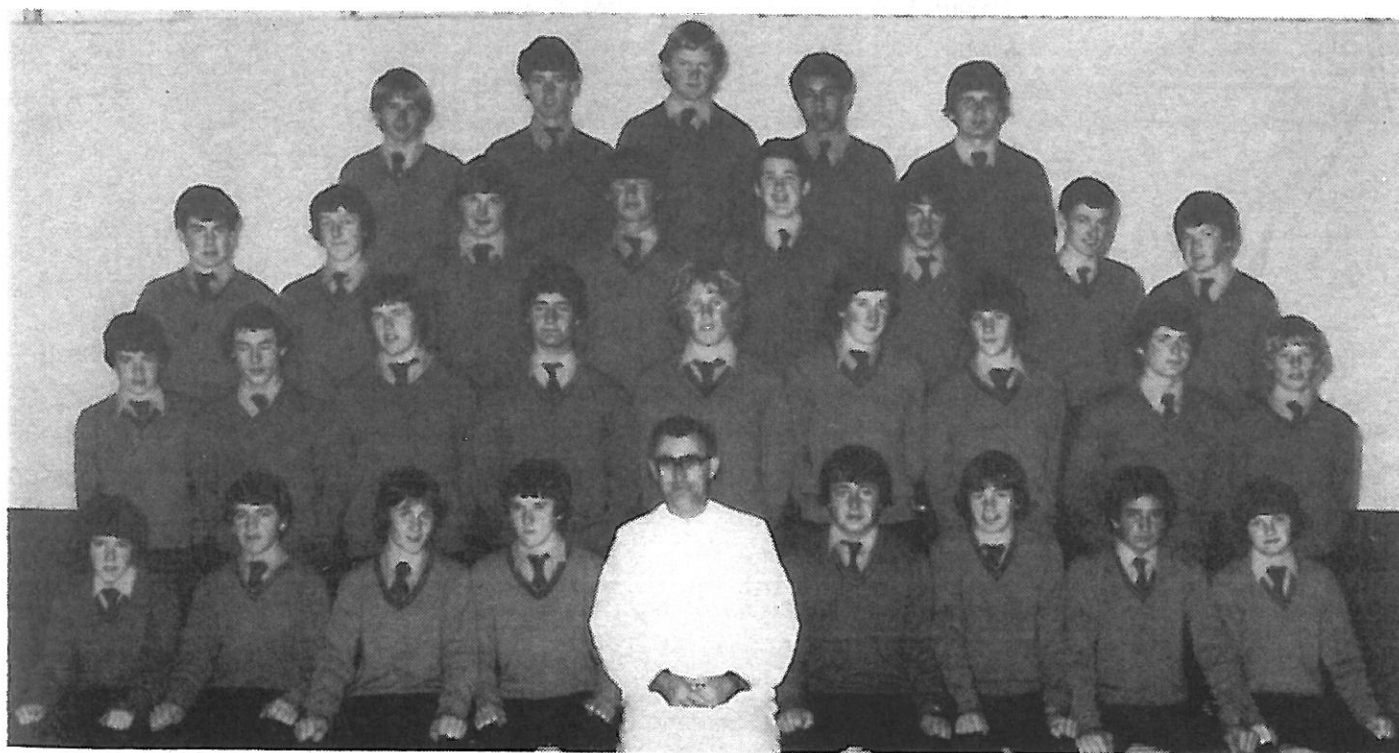

Debates and speech contests have provided keen competition and popular lunchtime entertainment during the second term.

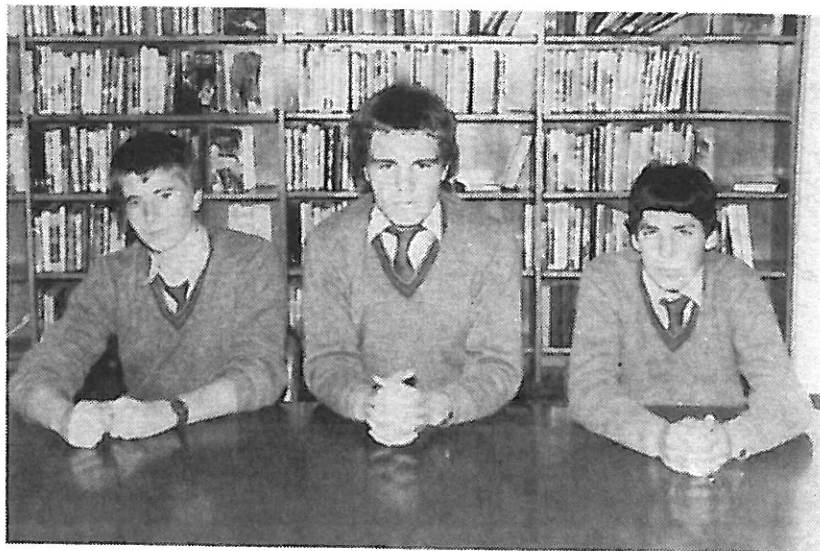
Benildus, with Tim Naish best speaker defeated Solomon in the final of the senior debate.

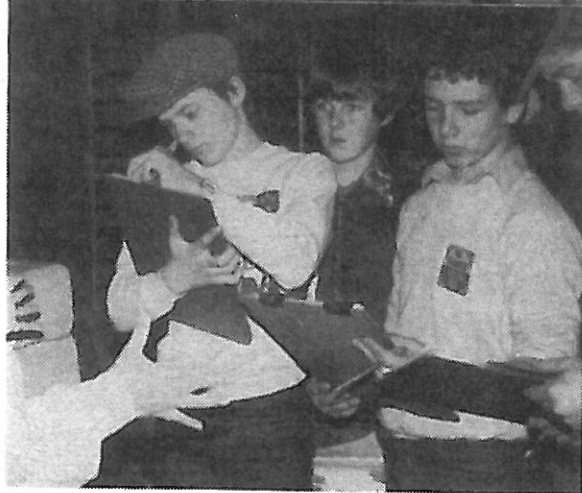
Thursday 10.15a.m. we arrived at Auckland Central Police Station where we enjoyed slides and a very interesting lecture. The rest of the days

activities included a visit to M.O.T.A.T, the Zoo and the Downtown Centre which was followed by a nice meal of Hamburgers and Chips at McDonalds.

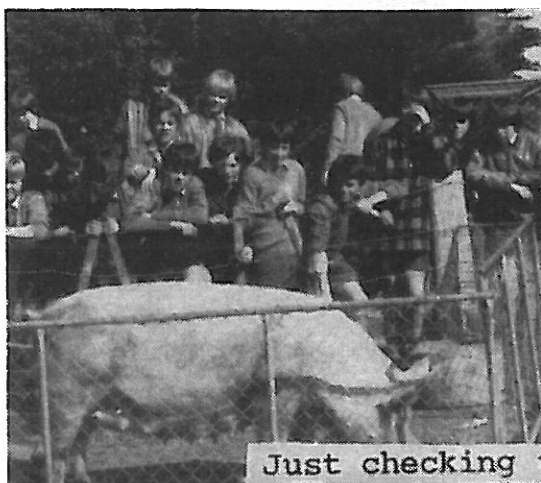
Friday, we left our Motel at approximately 10a.m. with the memories of a truly fantastic trip enjoyed by all participants.

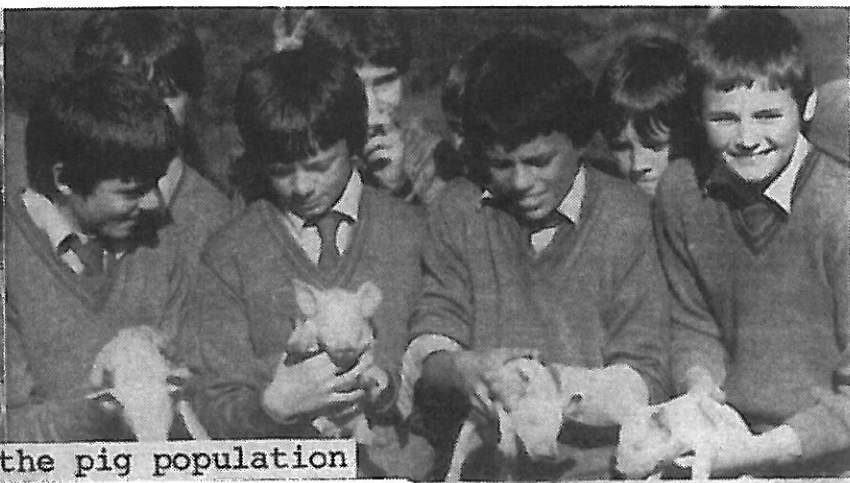

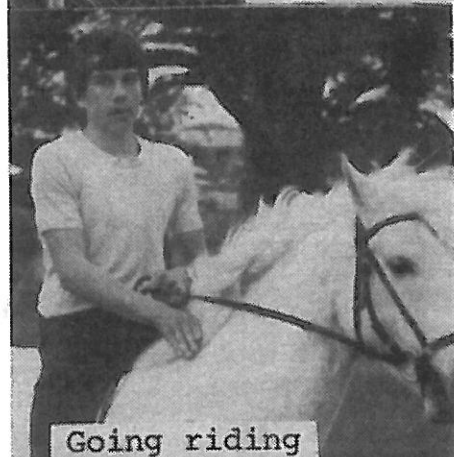

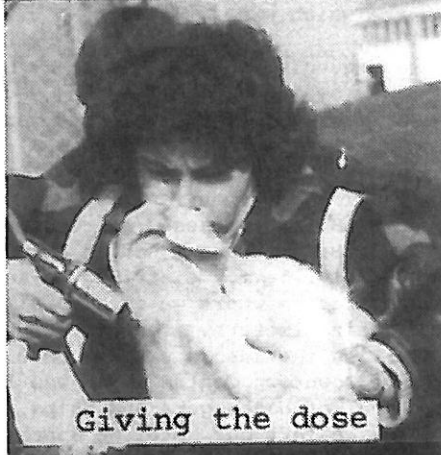


RURAL SCENES
