



PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

As we move ahead into the second twenty five years of our existence as a Catholic college, we need to be mindful that it will be a very different period. In looking back over what has happened in schools in the past twenty five years, there is much that was stable. In looking ahead into the next twenty five, the same thing cannot be said. While there have been slight modifications in the past, these are nothing compared to the changes which will be evident in schools in the future as they seek to come to grips with the needs of the young people.

The present ministerial review will lead some changes which, hopefully, will be able to meet the needs of young people in a more realistic way. We need to look at what is being done in the schools and ask some rather searching questions about the wisdom of continuing to carry on with activities which no longer have any bearing on the lives of the young people. is needed is a continual openness to the future and what it might hold, a continual sensitivity to what is happening to young people, a continual willingness to grapple with the problems of shaping that future and not just passively accepting it. need courage to do that. We need wisdom We need faith to do that. to do that. It is a problem too big for us to tackle alone, too involved to make sense of alone, but together with faith in the presence of the risen Lord with us, then we will cope.

If we have faith in the risen Lord, then we can stand back and reflect on what we are doing here. We can never afford to be satisfied. We can never afford to think There are just too many we have it made. we haven't taken into account. factors We must continually come back and ask whether we have in fact made this college an experience of the Good News for those We need to ask whether being who are here. here enables a person to be more fully human, whether God's desire for the wholeness of humanity is being furthered here. God's desire for this wholeness was such that Jesus became one of us to show what it was to be human. The challenge for each one of us, is to become as fully human as he was and this college needs to be an institution which helps people become that, together.

This Good News is about the love God has for each of us. The Church should be a centre of that love, a source of hope and inspiration. The quality of your people's experience in the Church will determine whether they choose to be part of it.

Young people today, have an intense desire to live life to the full, to experience the wonder of creation and to be related. If they fear the institutional Church will deprive human beings of the fullness of their human richness and integrity, then they will reject it, as they are doing.

It is a strange paradox that the Church which arose out of the expression of God's love, a God whose incarnate Son is the embodiment of all that is fully has come to be identified as source of deprivation. it is because of the emphasis that has been placed on the Fall, human weakness There is a need to focus on the original glory of creation and to show that it can move to fulfilment and despite through the limitations and restrictions, reaching its ultimate possibilities in Jesus. By doing this, it is possible to see love, perfection, order and goodness as God's gifts to gradually realised in this world in the next. and fully It emphasises the possibilities of love rather than the limitations of sin.

As a Catholic college, I believe one of the central aspects of our faith which should show, must be the belief that all people are created in the image

and likeness of God and, therefore, they have dignity simply because they exist. I believe also that people will be judged, not essentially on how "successful" they have been in job, sport, study, etc., but rather on the quality of their relationships. We stand to be judged on how well we have related with others, how well we have cherished the dignity of individuals who have come into our lives, how much they have been enriched through contact with us.

If I believe this, then it must influence the way I live and if that is a stand the takes then it should influence college the way this college operates. In taking this position, I believe there is no place in my life for violence, whether in deed or in word. I believe there is no place for prejudice in approach or attitude. I believe in everything that I do I must be working against injustice and whatever closes people off from becoming who they are capable of being. As a Catholic, I don't see another way that I can live the Good News. As a principal of a Catholic college, I would see myself striving to help build an environment without violence, without prejudice and without injustice. I would ask you all, whether pupil, parent, staff member or friend of the college, to commit yourselves to work to establish such an environment in this college, in your homes and in your relationships with others. If we can work together to enhance the dignity of the individual from the womb to the tomb, then, I believe, we are well on the way to building an environment which will be an experience of the Good News which Jesus brought.

As I look back over the seven years I have been here, there is much I thank God for in the way things have developed in that time. There are many people who have worked tirelessly to bring about the change that has occurred. I thank staff membvers, parents and students for the commitment that has been there. I would ask you all, however, to join together to support one

another as we step out on the water to make the future. There will be changes which some people will not like, there will be difficult decisions that have to be made, and there will be a need for a clear vision. I would ask you to pray that creative answers will be found, that courageous decisions will be made and that the Lord's wisdom will be with us here as we seek to face the real needs of young people and find ways to meet them.

With the approach of the Christmas season, I pray that the peace of Christ may characterise each of our lives and that this celebration of Christmas may be a joyous one for us all.


JEREMY LANDSHEER




I dominate my suburban surroundings, With my trunk and arms out wide. And numbers inhabiting nearby buildings Cannot equal those who within me hide.


KALAWATI

This year the third formers decided to continue the sponsorship of Kalawati, an eight-year old Indian girl who lives at Raphael, the Ryder-Cheshire home for children of lepers near Delhi.

Kalawati's father has died of the disease and her mother lives in the near-by quarry-leper colony. Because of our sponsorship, which was started in 1984 by that year's 3G, Group Captain Cheshire and his wife came to visit us and talk of their work for under-privileged people in the world.

Lady Ryder, who was a Resistance Leader in Europe, especially Warsaw, during World War II, had just returned from a tour of drought stricken Ethiopia and also India. She told us the children at "the Little White House" of Raphael, are totally dependent on money arriving from sponsors, to keep them. She described "our little girl" who is lively and fond of dancing, and who told her she had many brothers in New Zealand.

We were delighted to hear that our money really does go to keep a child alive and cared for. It buys her food and clothes and school books, and sometimes Kalawati is given the money to buy an icecream when she goes to the bazaar, as a special present from her New Zealand family at Francis Douglas.
