














BOARD OF GOVERNORS

After the activity of 1986, by comparison, the year 1987 was a relatively quiet one. The Board had to finalise its submissions on the Curriculum Review and also review the use of descriptors used in reporting School Certificate results.

The problem of recruiting teachers, but more especially in the Science and Maths subjects, has developed into a perennial problem and causes many headaches for the Principal. Otherwise, from an organisational view the year was uneventful.

What is eventful is the change that is going on around us which has been likened to being as dramatic as the last Industrial Revolution. It is essential that our schools are capable of adapting to this change and the speed of it, to ensure that our pupils are well equipped to handle it once they move on.

During the year the Board took the opportunity to review the College's position as educators of the young men of the future. In conducting the review the Board looked at several measures by which to guage how successfully this was being carried out. These included exam results, the spirit in the school, the environment for the pupils and teachers and the product being produced. In addition, because this is a Catholic College, the pupils' attitude to the "Good News." The Board believes that all these measures are important but undue emphasis can be placed on any one particular measure, and if that is the criteria by which success or failure is guaged, then the College could be considered to have failed if one measure in one area did not measure up in one year. The Board does not accept that approach and believes that a far more evenhanded approach is demanded, taking a span of five or more years and taking into account all the measures in arriving at any conclusions. In any school there will be high and low points in any one of the measures mentioned, but to react to any one in isolation could cause distortions not in the best interests of the school community

The Board thanks the Principal and his staff for the manner in which they undertake the education of the pupils in their charge, and for their co-operation with the Board.

During the year one Board member, Ian McLauchlan, was transferred to Palmerston North on promotion. We congratulate Ian on his promotion, wish him well for the future and thank him for his efforts on behalf of the Board.

PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

In our rapidly changing world, it is important that we have some firm foundation on which to build and something against which to judge the worth or otherwise of what is being proposed for this college. We need to ask what this is. There is so much emphasis at present on power being used to dominate others, to control and dictate to them. This power is a dividing power and one which traps and binds people. If we are to stand for anything in this college it should be that we have a power here which is different. The power we have is a power which will bring people together to bless, to enable people to be with each other, to give and foster life, the power of brotherhood and sisterhood, of community.

We are built on the foundation of the apostles with Jesus Christ as our cornerstone. We live in the tradition of the Catholic Church and in a special way in the tradition of John Baptist De La Salle and of Fr Francis Douglas. This is not a distant tradition, a tradition which is lost in history. Rather, we are caught up in passing on a living tradition which has the power to unleash a vitality in this world, a world which is so caught up in the morbid task of dying. Our theme this year was to "Choose Life - life in all its fullness" and it is this which we have sought to do during the course of it. This is a counter cultural position and one which challenges us to look carefully at where we find life. John Baptist De La Salle worked with young people over three hundred years ago and he had a living dream to enable people to open their eyes of faith and to see the presence of God in the everyday aspects of life. He wanted people to see that presence, that manifestation as a way in which God was saying she is not absent from this world. Indeed God is the force which is an ever present cohesive force in all that is, a force which drives away all senseless loneliness from our lives.

As we have gone about the events of this past year, we have sought to remember we are in the presence of that God. We have sought to examine what we are doing by asking how well it enables the development of an environment which is an experience of the Good News Jesus brought. We have sought to opportunities for young men to grow as people. to gain knowledge and to acquire skills. These are goals which are worth striving for and putting a considerable amount of energy into achieving. The degree to which we achieved these goals varies, but I feel confident that during the course of this year aspects of all those goals were reached. It is important to remember that our confidence rests not on having all the right answers, but on who it is that walks with us. Hence, some of us till the soil, some plant, some water, but it only God who gives the increase. His Spirit alive in the midst of us brings forth the growth.

With confidence in this God we have moved ahead during this year. We have become conscious, however, that there is a constant need to examine the assumptions from which we work and to ensure that we are not taking on board the oppressive aspects of our society. In seeking to make this place an experience of the Good News for those who are here, we need constantly to fight against those things which prevent this happening. Thus the oppression that comes from racism, from sexism, from prejudice of any form must be opposed. In order to do this we need people in the college who are prepared to confront these issues. In a boys school the danger of sexism being reinforced through comments, jokes and is very high and we must be structures careful to fight against that. In a predominately white, middle class school population the danger of racism and prejudice against those not so well off, is high and we need to help

people see the injustice that is so very real in society and provide them with the opportunity to acquire the skills and knowledge to enable them to work for justice and peace.

If we are going to be true to Jesus, then we have to look at what he was on about. His real concern was for those who were oppressed. He took their side and opposed those who were oppressing. We need to play our part in following on in that tradition. John Baptist De La Salle took the side of the oppressed of his time. Fr Francis Douglas lay down his life for the oppressed he worked with in his time. Our challenge is to find an adequate way to live out that Gospel call now in 1987. The choice lies before us and we don't have the option of not choosing because by the very act of pretending to ignore the choice, we are taking the side of the oppressor. In each of our activities as individuals and as a college, we need to ask ourselves the question: "Who benefits from what I am doing?" Is it the rich and powerful or the people whom Jesus called blessed, the people John Baptist De La Salle worked for and the people for whom Fr Douglas gave his life?


We are inevitably faced with choices and choices are based on values which have to be acquired and this involves a long process of growth. This growth can come from overcoming the separation of faith from life. We claim to work from the values of Jesus and maturing as Christians does not mean saving more prayers so much as making more right decisions. decisions based on Gospel values. This meturing is something we all must work towards and particularly those who are coming to teach and administer in Catholic schools. As we come to the end of the year, let us pray that we may mature in this way and that the young people who leave us this year may move out from here and grow in such maturity.

This year we say farewell to two of the Brothers. With Br Michael's departure comes a break with our Australian Brothers. Since 1959, when five Brothers came from Australia to start the college, through until now, there have always been Brothers from Australia on the staff. On behalf of past parents and pupils, I would like to publicly thank those Brothers represented by Br Michael here with us, for the gift of those years of service given to the students in this country and city. The college would not be where it is today without such extraordinary generosity. To Br Michael I extend a special word of thanks for his five years with us, a hope that the return to his home country will be a joyful experience and a wish that he takes with him enriching memories of his time here. Br Stephen also leaves us to take up a position at De La Salle College in Auckland. As an old boy and past School Captain, Br Stephen was welcomed back to the college as a teacher with considerable enthusiasm three years ago. In his time with us he has established himself as a greatly gifted person who has used those gifts for the benefit of people here with great generosity. We will miss him, but wish him well as he broadens his experience and enriches the life of De La Salle College.

As we come to the end of the year, I extend sincere thanks to all those who have worked on behalf of the college. A special thanks to the staff who have sought to work with the boys to make this a good place to be. I think we are fortunate to have the quality of staff employed here. To the Board and P.T.A. I extend the thanks of the staff and boys for their work on behalf of the college and finally to the boys for the fine qualities that have been displayed and the many occasions when they have responded so well and made me feel so proud to be part of this place. I pray that you may all experience God's peace and joy this Christmas.

CADETS

1987 saw the end of an era with the College Cadet Unit disbanding. The Unit had begun in 1960, and developed over the years under the leadership of Brother Francis., Brother Conrad, Mr Leo Walsh and Brother Adrian. When the Unit first began, Cadet Units were present in most high schools and involved boys from Form 3 to Form 7. Barracks weeks were held, especially at the start of the school year, with much emphasis on drill and military activities.



The most recent changes which brought about the withdrawal of the College Cadet Unit has been the development of small. community-based units. These have been developed along the lines of the Air Training Corps and have a stronger military emphasis. There was considerable pressure on the unit to move to a weekly two-hour training session which just was not possible in the college timetable. This had consequences when our students attended N.C.O. camps and were disadvantaged by the standards expected.

In 1971, a change in government policy saw the College Unit being one of about thirty which opted to continue, with more emphasis on outdoor education and less assistance from the army. This fitted in well with the philosophy of the college and the Unit won the Riddiford Cup for best cadet unit in the Central Region on a number of occasions. The William Friar Medal given for the best under officer was won by college cadets on 18 occasions out of 27 years — an outstanding record by any standards. Matthew Crow won the medal for 1986.



The Cadet Unit has been a very valuable part of the College programme, and its presence will be missed. Thanks are expressed to all concerned with the units over the years, especially the Officers, Under-officers and N.C.O.'s, Regular Force Instructors and Area Training officers.


