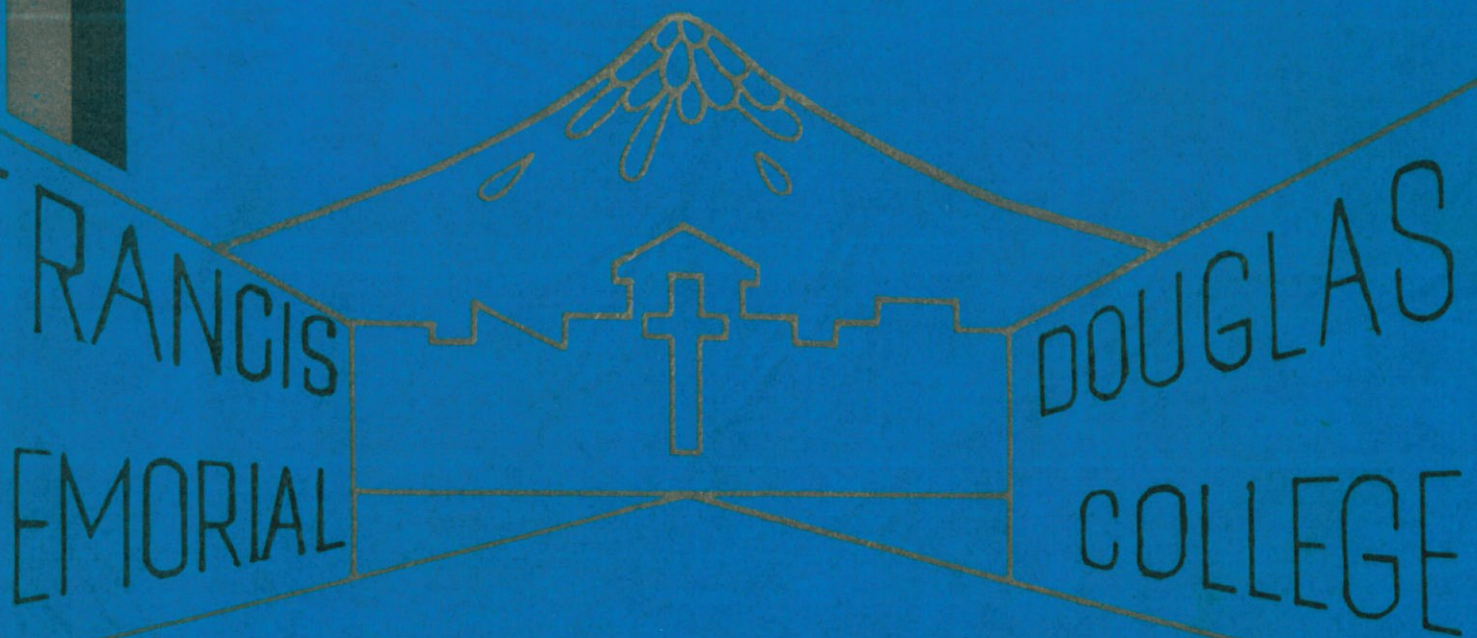

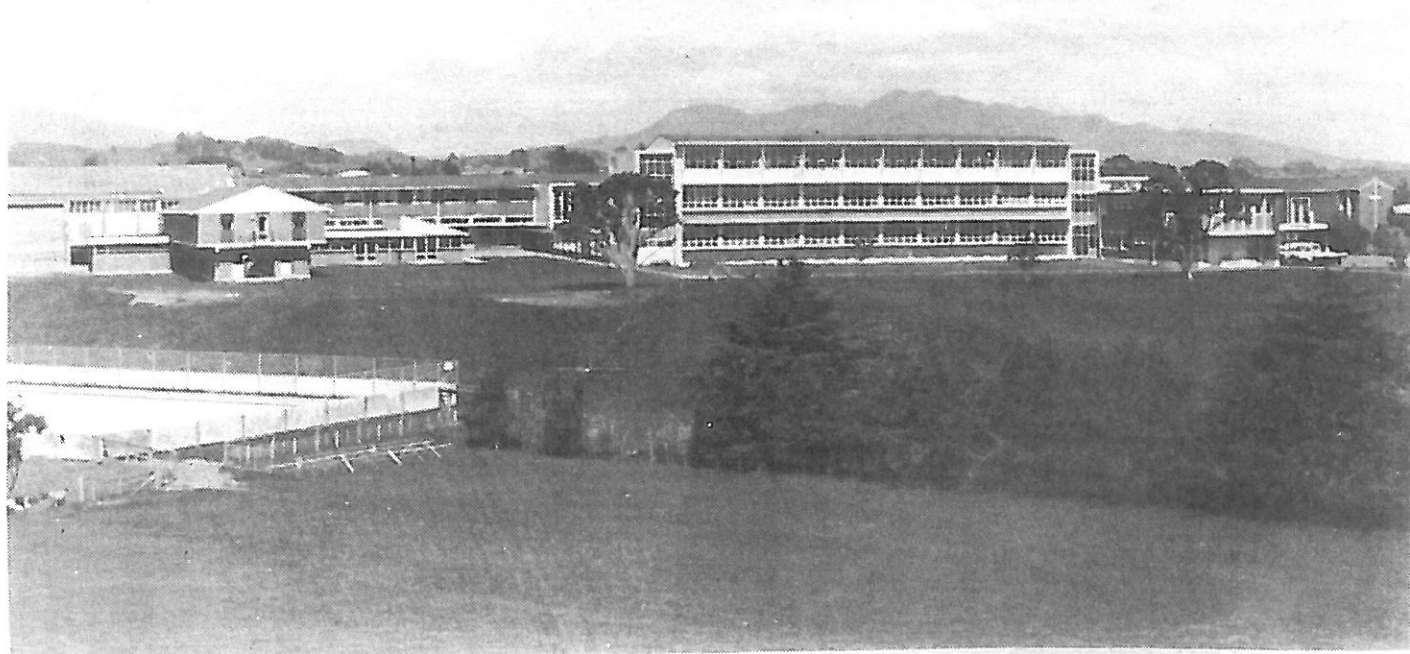

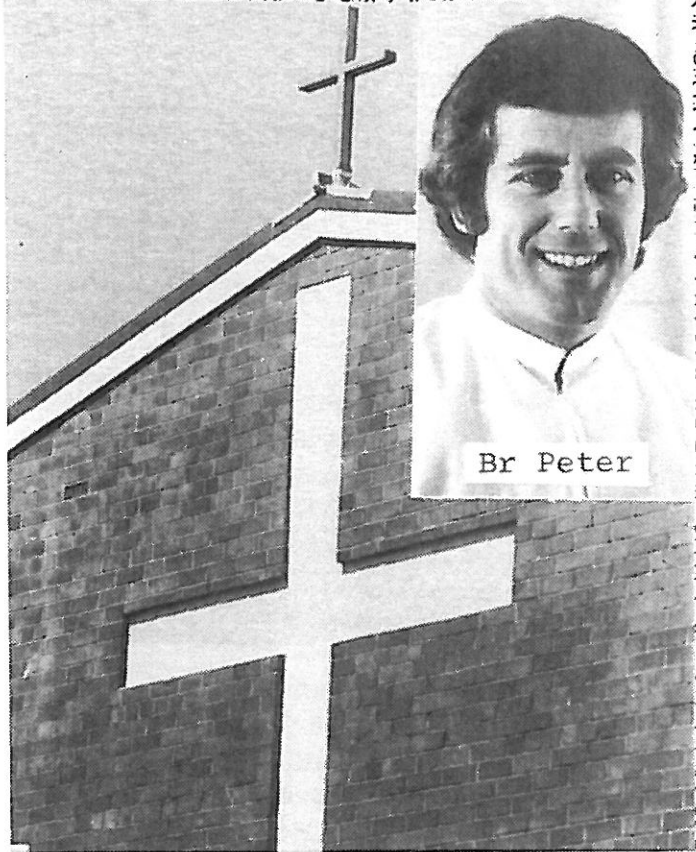

PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

At the end of twenty years of existence, this college can look back with a considerable amount of pride on what has been achieved. During those twenty years the college has sought to educate boys to an understanding of themselves, of others and of God and to see the wonder of the world in which they live and the part they can play in it. A very important aspect of this education has been the attempt to have people see their lives and what is involved in them through the eyes of faith.

When people over twenty years ago began thinking about and working towards the establishment of a Catholic boys college in the province they were seeking to create a college with a distinctly Catholic character. In the course of the last twenty years many people have sought not only to preserve this character but to enhance it. This is the legacy that we who now make up Francis Douglas College have inherited and we must make sure that what we hand on to those who come after us is not a betrayal of that original dream. We have a responsibility to be aware of our history, to be conscious of the efforts that have been made and we must know what it is we are seeking to preserve.

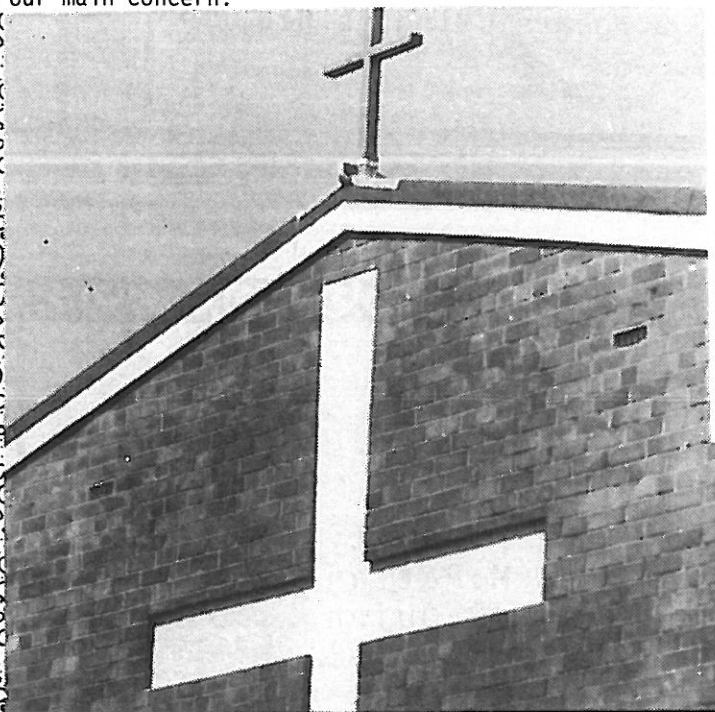

This is indeed true, we are facing costs which are increasing regularly and we will be in a better financial position after integration. Let us not be lulled into a false sense of security, however, because finance is not our main concern.



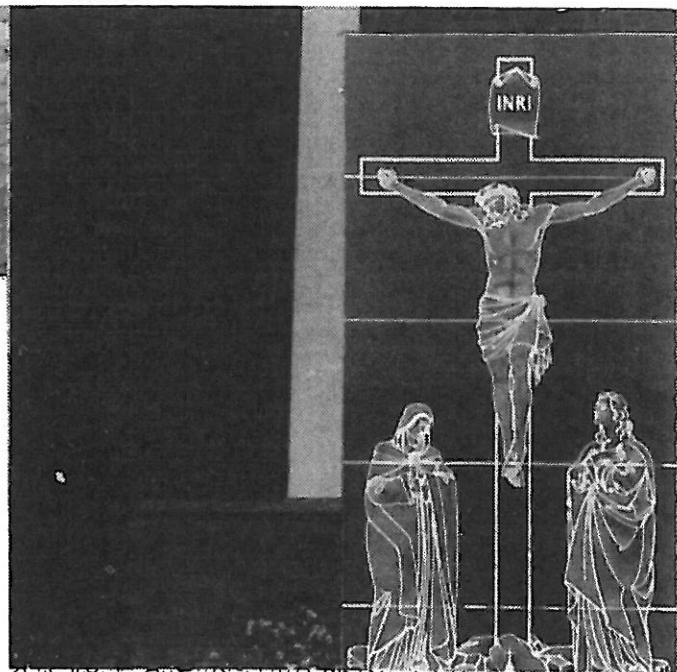

The lack of finance will never bring about the downfall of Catholic schools. If Catholic schools go out of existence it will be because those involved no longer have enough confidence in what they are doing to sustain the momentum and sacrifice. If people believe in something enough they will lay their very lives on the line for it. We need to ask ourselves if there is anything about Catholic education that makes it worth the sacrifice that is involved.

I believe that we must be essentially different. We should not be the same as the state schools in this city and if we are then we really have no right to exist. We must be seen to be different, to offer an alternative, and the characteristic which makes us different must be the fact that we are Catholic.

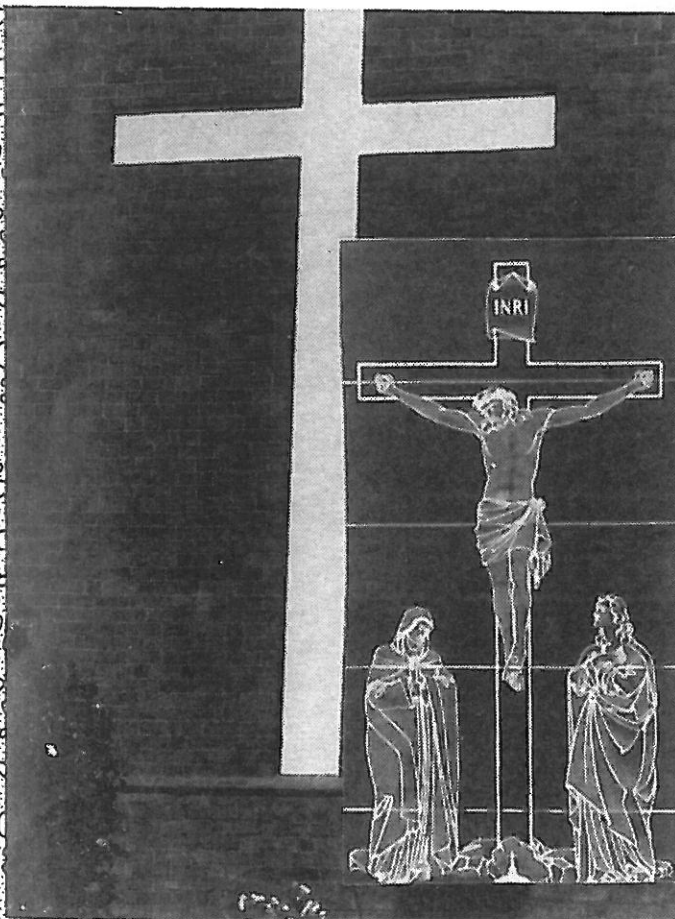
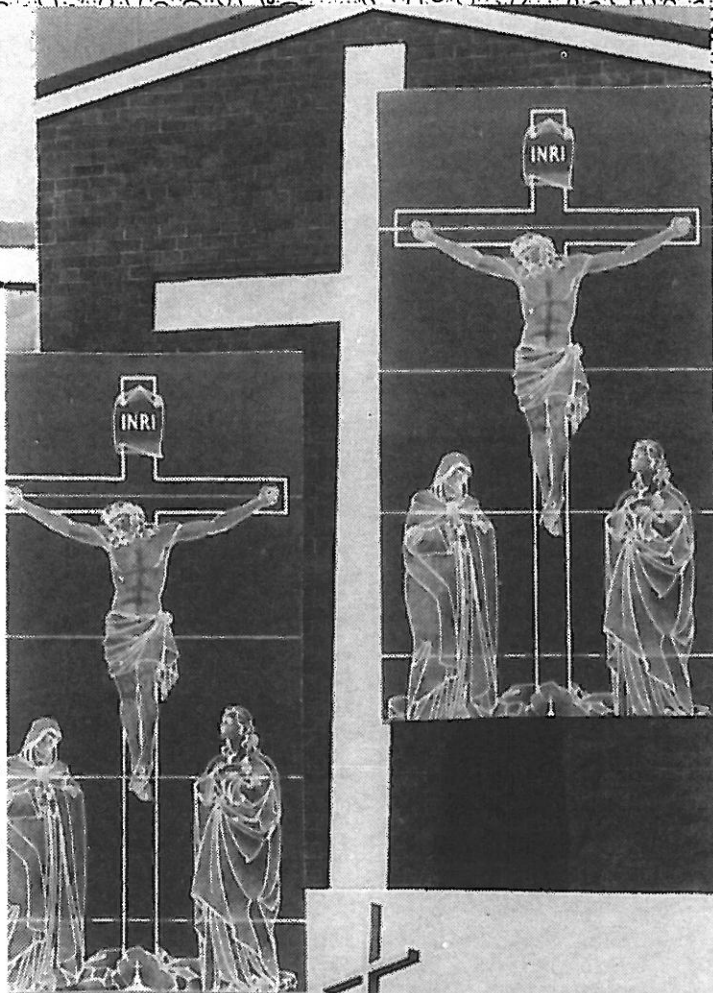


This means that we must be seen as a sign of faith, as a statement to this city that Christ has come and that faith is at the very heart of our lives bringing meaning to all that we do. It means that Jesus Christ must be the reference point for what happens here and the purpose for our existence so there must be constant reference to the Gospels and frequent encounters with Christ. It means that the College must assist in the introduction of young people into the traditions and heritage of the Catholic Church. It means that the very way the College is organised and the way people relate here must shout out the Good News that God is alive and that he loves each one of us.



I believe there is the possibility of this College being Catholic in this way but it will not be achieved just because we would like it to be. It must be worked at constantly and people involved in the college must see this as worth working towards. It becomes important for people to look carefully at their motivation in sending their sons to the college because the college must work in union with the home if it is to bring young people into the community of believers. We must be united in our aims, we must be working for the same ideal because we can only be different if we are prepared to work together.

It is important that we seek to be a "good" school in the normal sense of being a genuine and academic institution but as the time of integration into the State system grows closer it is going to become more important that we identify, preserve and enhance the characteristics that are special to us. I feel it is a great honour and a somewhat awesome responsibility to return to Francis Douglas College and be asked to follow in the footsteps of Br Jerome, Br Julian, Br Raphael and Br Osmund, all of whom worked to develop the special characteristics the college now has. Their work must be continued and, especially once we integrate, we must look to the future with hope, confident that what we have is precious and important and be willing to share our richness with others, a richness which is unashamedly Catholic.



I look forward with great anticipation to what Francis Douglas College can become because I can look back on our history and see the way God has been with us and so as we step out into the future I am confident He will remain with us.

Let us join together in asking God to give us the wisdom and strength we need to realise our potential as a Catholic College.

I thank the Lord for the blessings we have received this year and over the past twenty and pray that His peace will be with all those associated with the College.

SECOND FIFTEEN

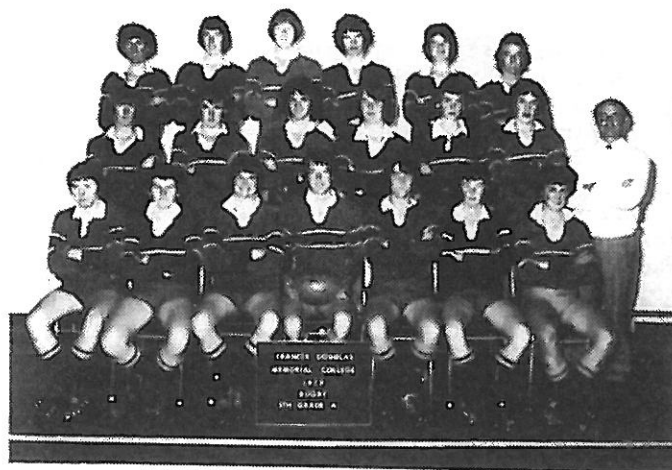
The Second XV known as 5A established a near invincible record of seven wins, two draws and five losses.

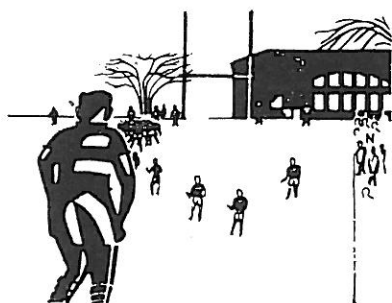

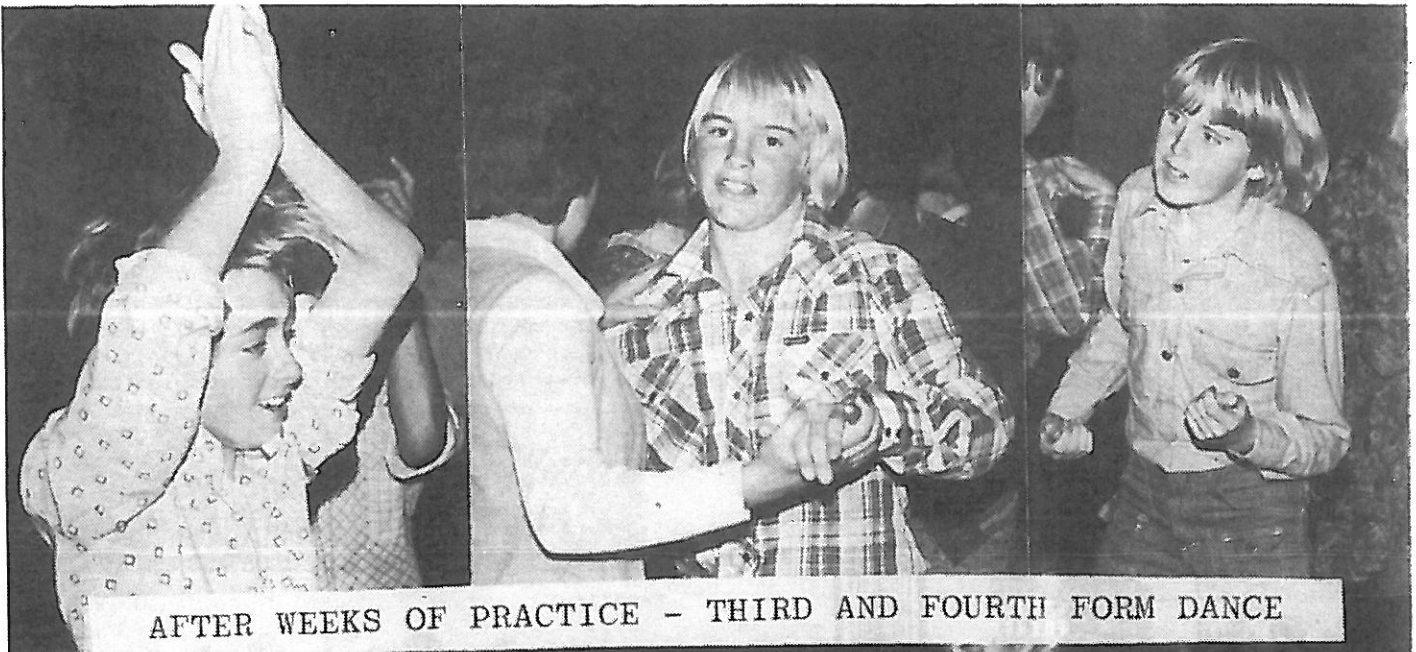
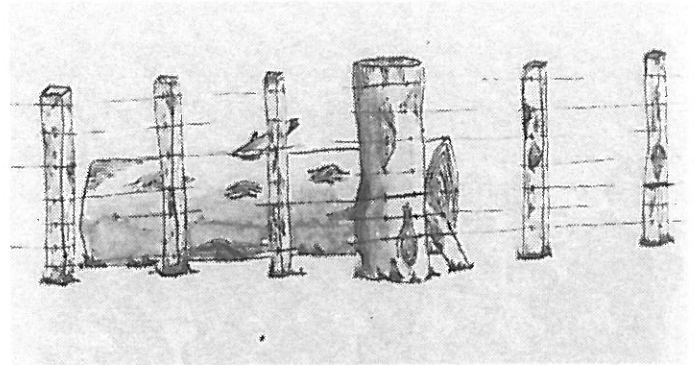

WEIGHT - TRAINING

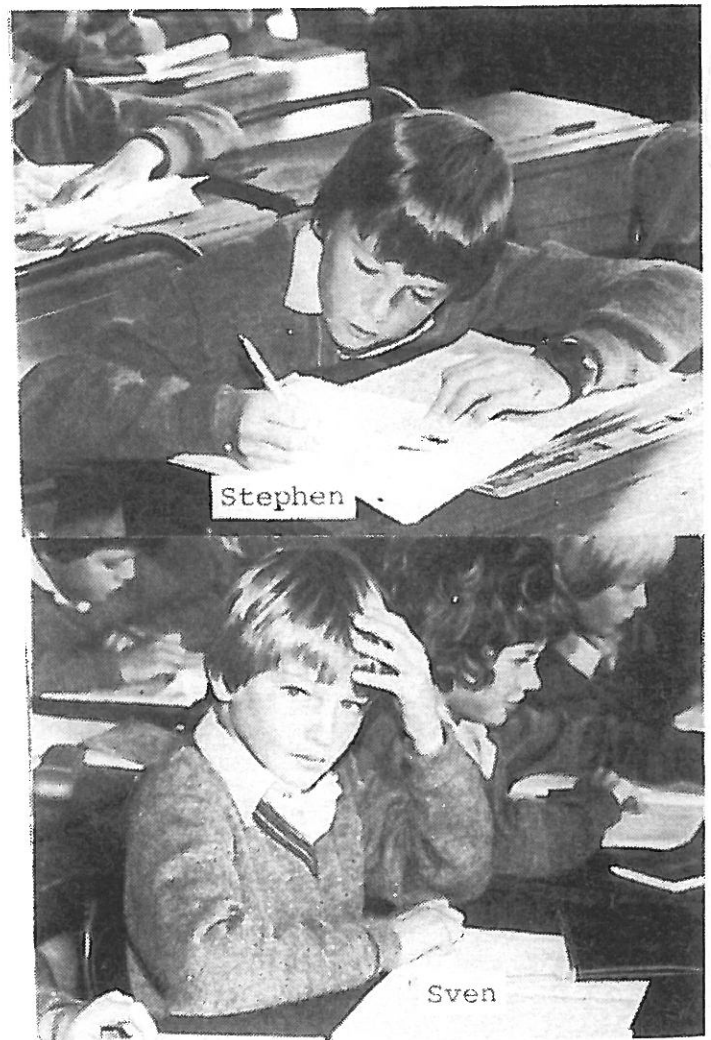

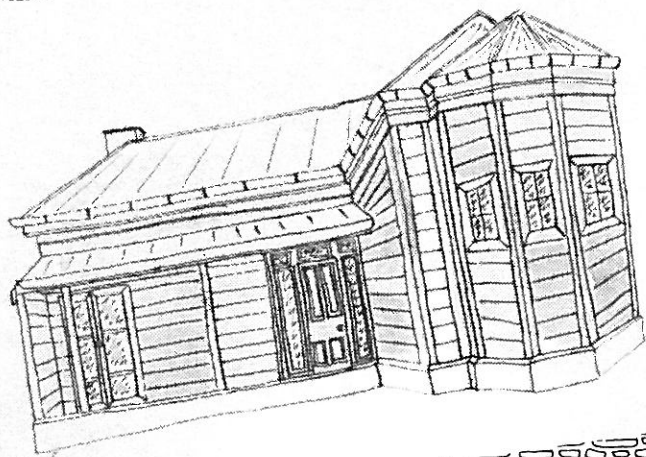
Numbers soon grew as enthusiastic boys encouraged others to join in and a solid core of strong willed and determined boys formed a group.

12TH GRADE SOCCER

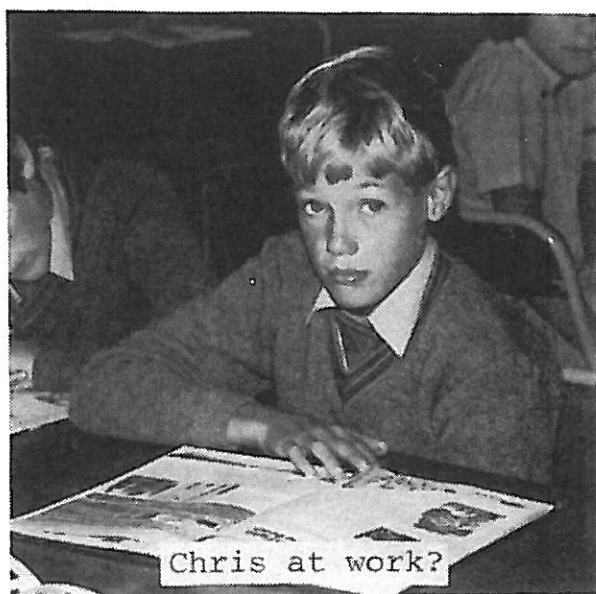

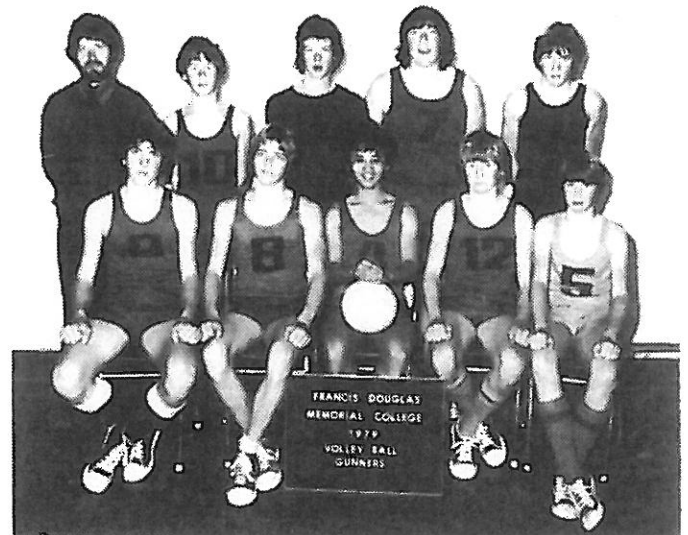
VULCANS

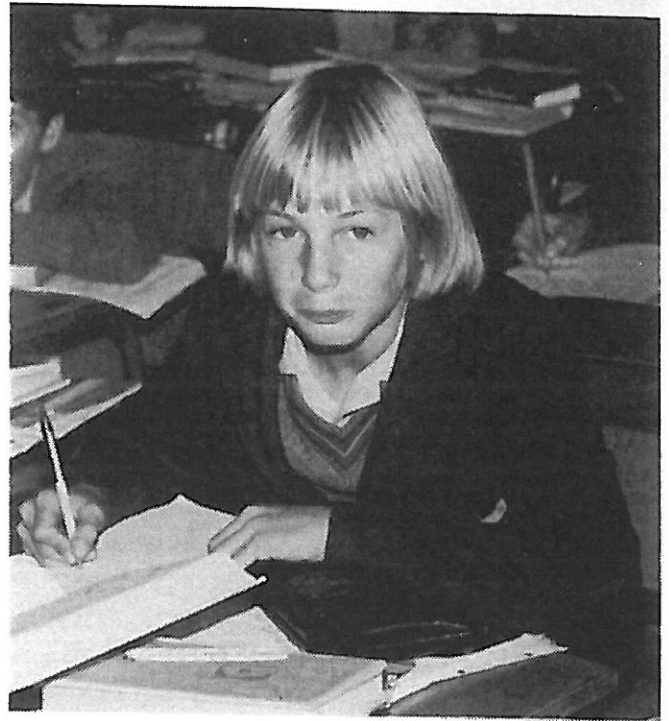

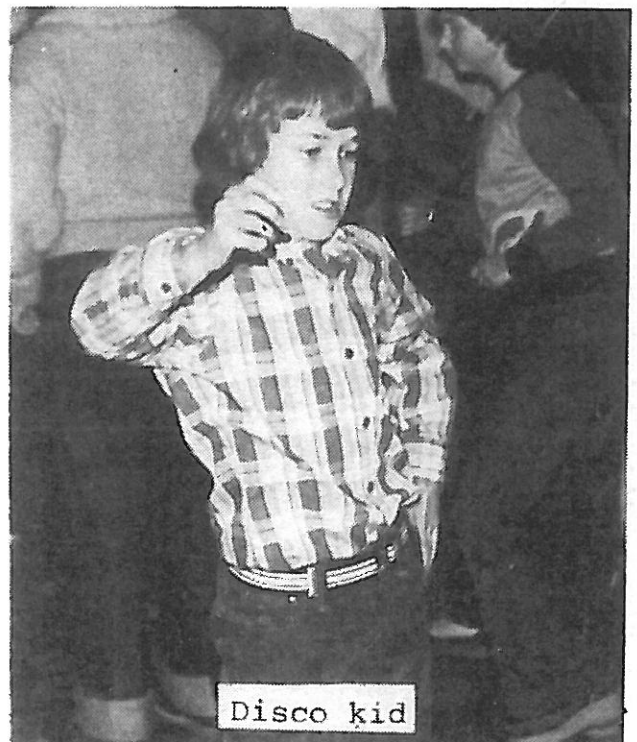
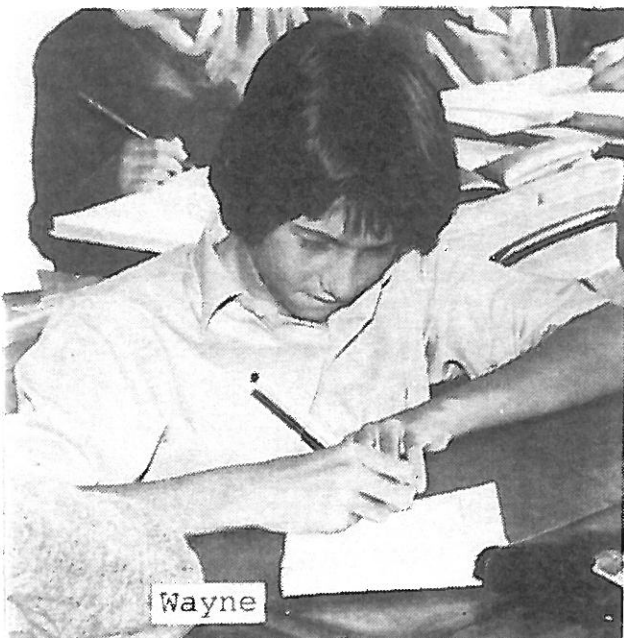

We played at the Y.M.C.A. which has good facilities. The team would like to thank Mr. B. O'Neill for his time and effort in coaching us.

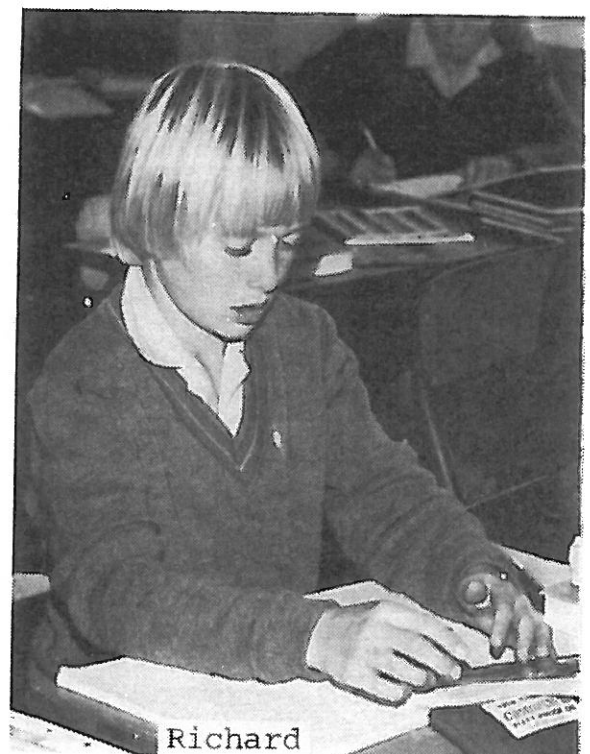
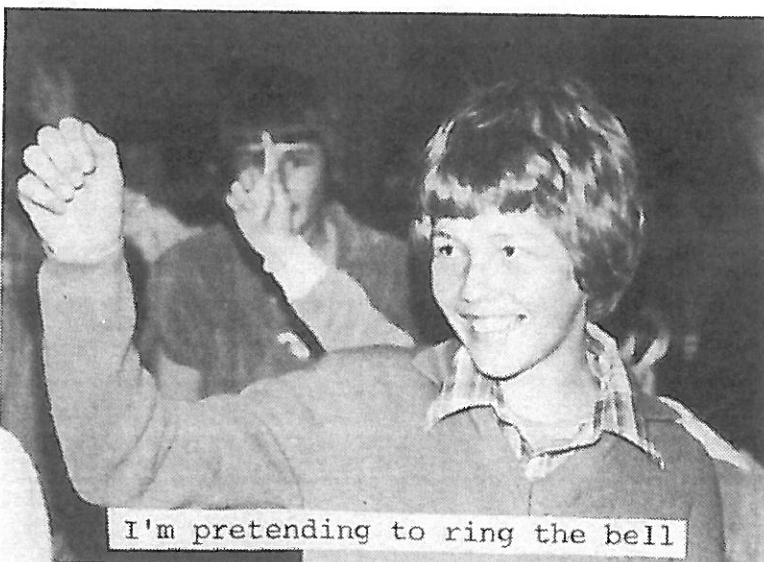
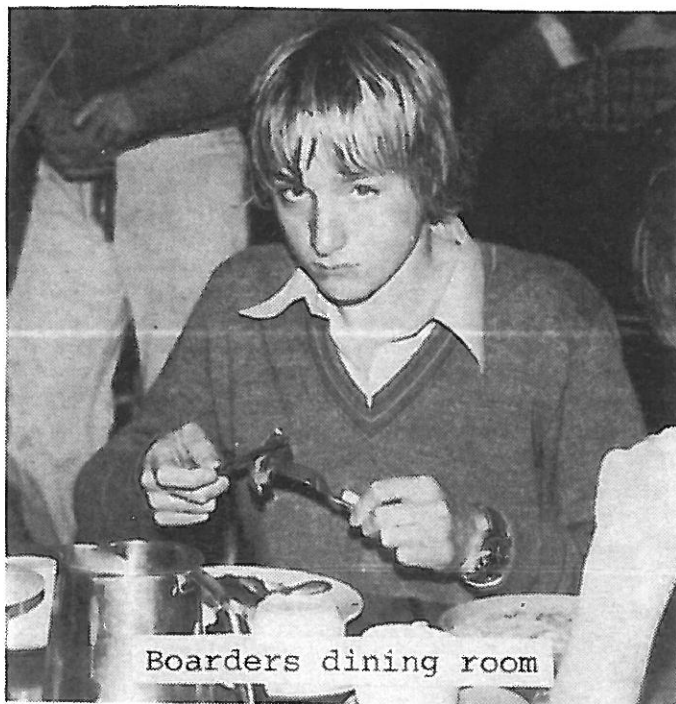
